BYE-LAWS OF THE ISLE OF MAN SOUTHERN DISTRICT AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY

1. Person's resident in any part of the Island shall, except where otherwise stated, be allowed to compete for any prize other than rabbits and implements.
2. All exhibitors shall send their entries to the Secretary. Blank entry forms may be obtained from the Secretary.
3. No stock implements or agricultural produce shall be admitted to the showground without an admission order, which may be obtained from the Secretary.
4. Private tent for exhibition of feeding stuffs, trade stands etc. apply to Secretary for charges.
5. All stock, produce or articles exhibited must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor at the time of making the entry and all Entire Horses, Bulls, Rams and Boars must be kept in the Island at least three months before or after their exhibition. All consigned and exhibited livestock must be identified by means of a DEFA approved Official Mark or Official Tag, which must be compliant with current legislation.
6. The entry form must be signed by the exhibitor and in the case of livestock, must describe the breed, age, by whom bred (if known) and full particulars, according to the class in which he intends to exhibit.
7. No animal shall be eligible to be exhibited in more than one class, extra classes excepted.
8. Any exhibitor who shall be proved, to the satisfaction of the Society, guilty of knowingly gaining or attempting to gain a prize by a false entry or misrepresentation of any kind, shall be deprived of all prizes he may be entitled to at such Show.
9. In case there be only one exhibitor in any class, such exhibitor shall be entitled to take a prize provided that the judge considers the exhibit to be of sufficient merit.
10. All exhibits must be on the Showground by 8.30am (excluding light horses) on the day of the Show and must remain there until 4pm on Saturday. Light Horses may be removed from the Show Field after their classes have finished. Any exhibitor removing his exhibit before 4pm shall forfeit all prizes he may have gained, and shall, if not a prize winner, be liable to a fine of £10.
11. All servants in charge of exhibits shall be subject, whilst on the Showground, to the orders of the officials appointed by the Society of the management of the Show.
12. A Ticket, to be furnished by the Society, must be firmly tied on to each exhibit before it can be admitted to the Showground, and, with the exception of such tickets, the exhibits must bear no mark indicative of ownership.
13. No person shall exhibit stock from any farm where there is at the time or has been within 6 months previously, any disease within the meaning of the Isle of Man Diseases of Animals (Prevention) Act 1948.

14. Every exhibitor of livestock shall be liable to pay to the Society a sum not exceeding £1,000 as and for liquidation damages, if any animal which he intends for exhibition is, in the opinion of the Society Stewards, affected with any contagious or infectious disease which in the opinion of such Stewards is likely to prove dangerous to other animals, and for each and every such case if more than one.

15. Any persons objecting to a prize being awarded to any exhibitor must hand his protest in writing to the Secretary on the Showground, accompanied by a Deposit of £25.00, before 4:30pm on the day of the Show and such protest shall forthwith be laid before the Protest Committee. If the protest be upheld the deposit will be returned, otherwise it will be forfeited to the Society.

16. Prior to a Show a sub-committee consisting of 3 members of the Committee, being non-exhibitors, shall be appointed to attend on the Showground to consider any Protest or Complaint that may be lodged, and the decision of such sub-committee (Protest Committee) shall be absolute and final. The third member of the Protest Committee shall be a Member who will be chosen upon receipt of a written protest and will have knowledge of the type of exhibit which is the subject of the protest.

17. Neither the Society nor any of its Officers or Servants shall be in any way responsible or accountable for any loss, damage or injury that may happen from any cause or circumstances whatever to Exhibitors or Competitors or their Servants or to any Exhibit or Property brought on to the Showground. The Committee insist that all Exhibitors shall have a responsible person in charge of their exhibits of Horses and Cattle.

18. The Committee reserve the right to refuse entry into the ring, anyone whom they consider unsuitable to be in the ring. No children under 10 years of age to accompany a handler in the showing ring.

19. The Committee reserve the right to authorise the sale of all refreshments on the Showfield.

20. No substitutions shall be allowed other than stated in the Schedule.

Bye-laws concerning The Light Horse Classes only.

21 Changes to rider (with the exception of the Equitation/Handler classes) at the discretion of the Light Horse Committee. Children who have not attained their 3rd birthday by 1st January of the current year will not be permitted to ride.

22 All Light Horse Classes will be treated as “Extra Classes”.

23 The age of the horse/pony is calculated from January 1st in the year of its birth.

24 Handlers of stallions or colts must be 14 years old or over.

25 All prize winners wishing to take part in the Grand Parade must be accompanied in the main ring by a competent adult handler.

26 Riding Hats - Correctly secured British Standard Skull Caps/Riding Hats that meet current Safety Standards MUST be worn by all Riders.

27 Any Exhibitor demonstrating abusive or aggressive behaviour towards stewards may be requested to withdraw from competition, and forfeit any prizes, at the discretion of the Protest Committee.

28 All riders must be suitably mounted and may be asked to leave the ring at the judge's discretion if deemed not to be.

29 The judges reserve the right to eliminate any horse or pony entered with any discrepancy as to height or age or any other misrepresentation.

30. Whips are not to exceed 75cm (30ins). Hunting Crops are permissible. This includes whips/sticks used by leaders in lead rein classes. Padded whips are recommended for WHP classes. A whip, if carried, must be held in the hand by the handle with the handle at the top. At all times the whip must be used; For a good reason, as an aid to encourage the horse/pony forward. At an appropriate time, namely when the horse/pony is reluctant to go forward with the normal aids of seat and legs. In the right place, namely down the shoulder or behind the leg. Never over arm. With appropriate severity. No more than twice for any incident. Riders must not hit a horse/pony before the start of a jumping course. Excessive use of a whip anywhere on a showground will result in disqualification of the horse and rider from any classes entered on that day. This includes but not limited to; Use of the whip to vent a competitor's anger is always excessive. Use of the whip which causes injury, e.g. broken skin or weal is always excessive. Use after elimination or retirement is always excessive. Use on the horse/pony's head and neck is always excessive. Using a whip from the ground after a fall or dismount is always excessive. If the rider's arm comes above the shoulder when using the whip this is always excessive.

31. Mobile telephones, smart watches and earpieces MUST not be taken into the ring, riders using these devices in the ring will be disqualified.
